RE: WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

Date: 27 July 2025 (Fourth Sunday of July)

Theme: "Blessed are those who have not lost hope" (cf. Pope Francis, Holy Year 2025)

Greetings of Grace and Peace!

We joyfully enjoin all parishes and institutions in our archdiocese to prepare for and fully celebrate the 5th World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly on 27 July 2025 (Sunday), in union with the universal Church and in the spirit of the Holy Year of Hope.

This annual celebration, held on the Sunday closest to the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, honors the vital vocation of grandparents and the elderly within the family of God. The theme this year, **Blessed are those who have not lost hope**", invites us to contemplate the steadfast faith of our elders as a wellspring of encouragement in times of change, loss, and uncertainty.

1. Pastoral Focus

We call on all parishes and institutions to center this celebration on:

- Honoring the elderly as bearers of hope, memory, and faith
- Creating **intergenerational encounters** that renew family and parish bonds
- Offering pastoral outreach to the lonely, forgotten, and homebound elderly
- Highlighting the elderly's spiritual role as **intercessors and evangelizers**
- Affirming the Church's commitment to build a culture that cherishes age and wisdom

2. Liturgical Celebration

All parishes and institutions are asked to:

- Dedicate the **Sunday Eucharist on July 27** to the theme of the day
- Preach a homily that reflects on **hope as lived and witnessed in old age**, drawing on Scripture (Simeon and Anna, Abraham and Sarah) and Pope Francis' Catechesis on Old Age
- Include a **special blessing for grandparents and the elderly** at all Masses
- Incorporate children and youth in the celebration, offering gifts, letters, or symbolic tokens of gratitude to their grandparents or elders in the parish
- Feature intercessory prayers for grandparents, elderly persons without families, and young people to remain connected with the wisdom of their elders

3. Suggested Pastoral Activities

Parishes and institutions may adapt the following activities as appropriate to their context:

- **Novena for Grandparents and the Elderly** (July 18 to 26) leading up to the Sunday celebration
- **Home and care facility visits** to bring prayer, gifts, and the Pope's message to the elderly who cannot attend Mass
- **Storytelling sessions** or "Faith Across Generations" panels with elderly parishioners sharing testimonies of hope and endurance
- **Family activities** such as "Letter to My Grandparent" by children, or art/essay contests on the theme
- Youth-Elder encounters where young people interview and pray with their elders
- Parish display boards or exhibits titled "Faces of Hope: Wisdom from Our Elders"

4. Catechetical and Prayer Resources

Parishes and institutions are provided with the following:

- A template for the **Grandparents and the elderly**
- A special prayer for grandparents and the elderly
- Reflection questions for small groups or family conversations

5. Reflection Points for Parish Use

We invite all groups and ministries to reflect on the following in preparation for the celebration:

- In what ways have the elderly in our parish or family shown perseverance in faith and hope?
- How can we better include and accompany the elderly in our pastoral work?
- What are the obstacles our elderly face in their physical, emotional, and spiritual lives and how can we respond with compassion?
- How can grandparents and elders be empowered as **transmitters of faith** to the younger generation?

Theme: "Blessed are those who have not lost hope"

Date: Sunday, July 27, 2025

Context: Holy Year 2025 - A Year of Hope

Goal: Celebrate the sacred vocation of grandparents and the elderly as witnesses of

hope, memory, and faith in families and communities.

1. PREPARATION PHASE (June-July 2025)

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| Special Blessing | After Communion, a solemn blessing for all grandparents and elderly. |

4. PASTORAL AND INTERGENERATIONAL ACTIVITIES

| Activity | Participants | Description |

| Letter to a Grandparent | Students | Children and teens write letters to grandparents about what they admire and have learned from them. |
| Art or Essay Contest | School-age Youth | Theme: "My Grandparent, My Hope." Exhibit in parish grounds. |
| Rosary of Generations | All Ages | Each mystery led by a different generation; intention for family unity and the elderly in distress. |

- 1. Sign of the Cross
- 2. Opening Prayer (below)
- 3. Daily Intention and Scripture
- 4. Short Reflection
- 5. Novena Prayer (same each day)
- 6. Intercessory Prayers
- 7. Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be
- 8. Concluding Prayer of Pope Leo (optional once available)



Opening Prayer (for all days)

Heavenly Father,

we thank You for the gift of life and for the blessing of our grandparents and the elderly. They are the guardians of memory, the keepers of hope, and the transmitters of faith. As we walk this novena in anticipation of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, open our hearts to listen to their wisdom, honor their presence, and accompany them in love.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

DAY 1 – July 18

Theme: Hope in Old Age

Scripture: "Even to your old age I am he, and to gray hairs I will carry you." (Isaiah 46:4) **Reflection:** God's promise does not fade with the years. In every wrinkle, every scar, there

is grace.

Prayer Intention: For elderly persons who feel forgotten or abandoned.

DAY 2 - July 19

Theme: Grandparents as Pillars of the Family

Scripture: "Your wife shall be like a fruitful vine... your children like olive shoots around your

table." (Psalm 128:3)

Reflection: Grandparents help keep families rooted in faith, memory, and love.

Prayer Intention: For all grandparents raising their grandchildren with love and sacrifice.

DAY 3 – July 20

Theme: Elders as Witnesses of God's Faithfulness

Scripture: "Now, Lord, you may let your servant go in peace... for my eyes have seen your

salvation." (Luke 2:29-30)

Reflection: Like Simeon and Anna, the elderly help us recognize Christ in the ordinary. **Prayer Intention:** For all elderly persons who spend their days in prayer and adoration.



DAY 4 - July 21

Theme: The Gift of Intergenerational Love

Scripture: "One generation shall praise your works to another, and shall declare your

mighty acts." (Psalm 145:4)

Reflection: When elders and the young walk together, a future filled with hope is born. **Prayer Intention:** For stronger bonds between grandparents and their grandchildren.

DAY 5 – July 22

Theme: Hope in Suffering

Scripture: "We do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, inwardly we are

being renewed day by day." (2 Corinthians 4:16)

Reflection: Physical weakness does not diminish the strength of faith.

Prayer Intention: For elderly persons who are sick, homebound, or in pain.

DAY 6 - July 23

Theme: The Vocation of Prayer

Scripture: "They shall still bear fruit in old age; they shall be fresh and flourishing." (Psalm

92.14)

Reflection: The quiet prayers of grandparents hold up the world.

Prayer Intention: For elderly persons who intercede for their families and the Church.

DAY 7 – July 24

Theme: The Wisdom of Years

Scripture: "Wisdom is with the aged, and understanding in length of days." (Job 12:12)
Reflection: The elderly are not a burden, but a treasure. Let us sit at their feet and learn.

Prayer Intention: For society to value and listen to the wisdom of its elders.



DAY 8 - July 25

Theme: The Joy of Giving Life

Scripture: "Children's children are the crown of the aged." (Proverbs 17:6)

Reflection: Grandparents take joy not just in life lived, but in life passed on.

Prayer Intention: For grandparents mourning the loss of a child or grandchild.

DAY 9 – July 26 (Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne)

Theme: Saints Joachim and Anne - Models of Faith

Scripture: "The righteous flourish like the palm tree... planted in the house of the Lord."

(Psalm 92:12-13)

Reflection: The grandparents of Jesus show us that our role never ends in God's plan. **Prayer Intention:** For all grandparents and elderly persons, that they may find joy,

companionship, and spiritual fulfillment.

Novena Prayer (for all days)

Lord Jesus,

You were born of the Virgin Mary, the daughter of Saints Joachim and Anne.

Look with love on all grandparents and elderly persons.

Protect them! They are a source of wisdom, experience, and hope.

Bless them with good health, strong faith, and a loving family.

Help families and parishes to embrace and support them, and may they always know their worth in Your eyes.

May the memory of their lives be a blessing and their legacy bear fruit in future generations. Amen.

Optional Closing Prayer (Adapted from Pope Benedict XVI's Prayer for Grandparents)

Lord God, bless and protect all grandparents. Be with them as they age with grace and gratitude. Grant them joy in their families, peace in their hearts,



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and the certainty of Your abiding presence.

May they continue to share faith, hope, and love with the young and the old alike.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Bless them with strength when their bodies grow weak, with peace when their hearts carry burdens, and with joy when they feel forgotten or alone.

May their wisdom continue to guide us, their stories inspire us, and their prayers uphold us.

In a world that often moves too fast to listen, teach us to stop, to sit, and to honor them. Help us to learn from their faith, to walk beside them with tenderness, and to never let them feel invisible or discarded.

As we celebrate this day in hope, renew in all grandparents the sense of their sacred mission: to pass on the faith, to bless the generations, and to proclaim—through their lives—that Your promises endure forever.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lived in the warmth of Mary, Joseph, and His grandparents, and in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and always.
